Boardgame pieces:



1 Work in small groups. Nominate a reader for the group.



2 Start at the beginning and read the story.



3 At the end of each story card, you will need to make a choice.



4 Decide as a group and then go to the story card specified and move the boardgame piece.



5 Make sure you do the activity at least 3 times, making different choices each time and reaching different endings.



6 Do not always choose the answer you think would be most appropriate: try making different decisions to see what happens.



7 While doing the activity take notes about the following:

- What lessons did you learn?
- What practical strategies have you learned about including people with disabilities in each stage of the programme cycle?
- Which strategies could you apply in your role?



Quest for players

You are the programme manager of a disaster risk reduction programme being implemented through partner organisations in your location. The programme aims to improve disaster preparedness and resilience at the community and household levels as well as strengthen disaster risk management structures at the sub-national level.

The planned components for this project are:

- Strengthen community member participation in disaster preparedness and management processes by establishing community committees.
- Improve disaster preparedness at household and community level through risk mapping; community preparedness plan creation and implementation; and early warning system development
- Support the District Disaster Management Committee to clarify roles and responsibilities; create standard operating procedures for emergency response; and test these through simulations.

Your assignment is to manage the programme and take important decisions on critical activities during the implementation.
